The Last Will of Joseph Addings. Guilford County, North Carolina, August
15th 1828. Being low in health yet of sound mind & perfect senses, I make
this my last Will in Manner as follows. First that my Just debts be paid,
secondly, that my wife Maria Addings shall have one full third part of my
estate both Real & Personal during her life or widowhood, to dispose of as
she shall see proper,
Thirdly that my son Jonathan Addings shall have 1000 Acres of land, or
the whole tract lying on the West of his plantation.
Fourthly, That my son Mark Addings shall have twenty five Dollars.
Only. Having deduced to him his portion of land,
Fifthly I leave the plantation I now live on to be divided between my
son James Addings & William Addings Children, by a line running from
to South, half way between my farm & dwelling house, leaving Sa
the Eastern & the Children the Western section.
Sixthly I leave to daughter Maria Two sons Joseph & Anne W. Cyber

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tract of land lying on the Salisbury Road, which I purchased of John Wheeler if they Arrive to 21 Years of Age or to the survivor or if neither should live to that age it shall remain a reversion.

Twentiethly, To my daughter Hannah. son Joseph & Coffin I leave Ten Dollars only having Aided him a portion of Land.

Eighty To my Daughter Sarah Hughes I leave Two hundred & fifty Dollars.

Kindly To William Coffin I leave five Shillings or 62½ Cts, and to Abner C. Cushman, One Dollar, and the reversion if there be any, shall be Equally divided between my sons Jonathan, Mark & Saml Eddings William Eddings Children, Joseph I. Coffin, Sarah Hughes, Joseph & Abner H. Cushman, if they Come to the age of Twenty One years.

And Lastly I appoint Jonathan Eddings & Mark Eddings to be my Executors to the Above Named Will & sign this as my Last Will & Testament the day and year above written.
