In the name of God amen. - I George Ingle, Senr. of the County of Kentford
and State of North Carolina being of sound sense and memory but now in health considering
the uncertainty of human life and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die do
make, order and publish this my last will and Testament in manner and form as followeth.

First - I commit my body to the dust to be buried in a decent and
Christian manner - My soul into the hands of the living God hoping for salvation through
the mediation of Christ Jesus. - and as to the worldly property which kind Providence
has been pleased to bestow upon me I will it to be distributed as followeth.

1st - I will all my just debts to be well and truly paid after the discharge of
