I Marshall McLear of the County of Suferd being weak and frail
of body but sound of mind & memory Calling to mind my mortality &
knowing that it is appointed once for all men to die, Do make &
Ordain this my last will & Testament in form and manner as
followeth - First & principally of all I commend my Soul to God
who gave it, & my body to the dust, to be buried with decent
Christian Burial at the discretion of my Executors not doubting, but
at the last resurrection I shall again receive the same by the
Almighty power of God, And as touching my worldly estate
with which it has pleased God to bless me with in this life
I will and devise in the following way.

1st I will and devise unto my Son David McLean, a Tract of Land lying on the South Side of Allamance on which Aiken McLean now lives supposed to contain One Hundred & Twenty Acres to him the said

And as it regards my dear & beloved Wife and the rest of my dear Children that are younger than my son David. It is my Will, done and wish that they continue to live together with their Mother & carry on the Farm & Tanning as usual and in the same way as if I were living, and all my Property (not herein devised) to remain with them and as any of my Children may hereafter Marry or come of Age I wish to settle and live to themselves, it is my Will that my Dear Wife and my Executor give each of them either of landed or Personal Property to each Child as they may deem right in sound discretion - And it is further my Will that if my Wife should die, before my youngest Child comes of age or before a final distribution of all my Property is made. It is then my Will that my Executors at the death of my Wife Mat and with the aid and assistance of her or their eldest and most prudent make an equal division of my Property among all the Children that I have by my present wife.

And in case my wife should hereafter change her way of living and again Marry It is my Will upon that contingency to have that my Executors cause to be laid off to her, her new home in my Home tract, to include the dwelling house & other necessary out houses, and to give her in sound discretion such other Property as they may see proper - & the remainder of my Property to be divided among my Children as stated above. I will and devise unto my son David the sum of Five Shillings and to my Daughter Jane West the sum of Fifty Shillings, & to my Grand son James Hobbs the sum of Five Shillings which is to be paid at some future period when the Tanning becomes profitable, or when my Wife & Family can conveniently make it.

And I do hereby constitute Ordain and Appoint my sons David & David McLean Executors of this my Last Will & Testament - the Testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand & affixed my seal this 12th day of March A.D. 1834.

 boy Elijah, and One Negro Girl Elijah, my Clock and Case, Cupboard
 and furniture, One Desk, One Walnut Table, Two Beds & Bedding
 Furniture, One Wheel and Cart, two Horses, two Cows, One Saddle,
 One Saddle Horse, two Riding Horses, two Cows & Calves, two Choices,
 One Deer and two ewes two Choices, One Choice Horse tract, one Riding
 Carriage & gear, One turning stone, One bull tongue or short plow
 Chains, hammers, backbands, knives and Similitude Twenty five Dollars
 out of my Estate to buy a One horse plantation Wagon, I give her
 the above property during her natural life or widowhood, I also
 give her my house and plantation during her life or widowhood
 what is not otherwise devised hereafter and then to return to my estate.
- 3rd I give and bequeath to my Daughter Mary Relief Two Dollars out of
 my personal Estate and her proportional part of Lands.
- 4th I give and bequeath to my Daughter Lucy King and to the heirs of,
 her body One Negro Girl Hannah and her proportional part of the Real &
 personal estate where not otherwise devised
- 5th I give and bequeath to my Daughter Milly Potter One Negro girl Micky
 and Fifty Dollars out of my personal estate to make her equal her
 proportional part of my Real and personal estate where not otherwise
 devised of
- 6th I give and bequeath to my Daughter Elizabeth Hobbs One Negro girl
 Charles and her proportional part of my estate both Real & personal
