I, Jonathan Whitaker of the County of Guilford and State of North Carolina
being of sound mind and disposing memory do hereby certify that this
is my last will and testament as follows: First my will is
that my last debts and funeral charges be paid -
Secondly my will is that the mill and mill lot of Eight
acres that is my two thirds thereof being all I claim from
to be equally divided between my three sons, namely John
Jonathan and Jonathan Whitaker also my home plantation
in the same manner between my three sons, namely John
of Land in North Carolina also to be equally divided between
the three sons if they can agree amongst themselves
if not for them to choose some of their neighbors
to go Court thereby my will is that my Trust
of Land lying on meowing Creek being what is
between the said meowing Creek and the said
the said I give to my three daughters namely Anna
Mary and Mary Gordon and Hannah Thomas to be
equally divided between them but their husbands or
any of them can agree if not leave it to me of
their own choice and also their children and
what is to be paid

Nowwithstanding my will is that all my moveable estate be equally
 divided between all my sons and Daughters and for
 my children to come in for their Father Share of the
 moveable part of my Estate and I have some Demands
 of considerable amount against my son Henry in this
 time and thinking that upon a full acquittal for the
 same some security or attestation attached therewith
 equal both the debt and this may perhaps I do give
 a full discharge from my Demand or any other - to them
 both and may they way and lastly I do make
 and constitute and appoint my true son John Stanton
 and Jonathan Sant executor of this my last will and
 Testament utterly revoking and annulling all other
 wills by me since and intended to be made and (intending)
 this and no other to be my last will and Testament
 in writing Whom I have hereunto set my hand and
 Seal this the twentieth day of June 1726
 one Henry and Eight Annals and George Sir -
 James Seal and acknowledge by the
 said Stanton and Jonathan to be his last will
