It is my will & desire that my funeral expences & all my just debts be punctually paid as soon as circumstances will permit.

To my beloved grandson James Campbell son of Archibald Campbell I give & bequeath my gold watch.

To my beloved granddaughter Polly Campbell daughter of James Campbell I give and bequeath one suit of my wearing clothes the best that I may leave at my decease two cows & calves, six silver tea spoons & one half of my cupboards furniture.

To my beloved niece Sarah Covey I give & bequeath the other half of my cupboards furniture all my gree & all the rest of my wearing clothes beside the suit left to Polly Campbell.

To John Thorpe son of Aaron Thorpe I give & bequeath the sum of twenty dollars (And)

And as Aaron Thorpe & myself purchased a still between us & I yet
own one part I give & bequeath my part of the still to him.

All the rest and residue of my estate real or personal that I may have any
right or interest in I desire may be sold by my Executors & the moneys arising
therefrom to be divided in the following manner: one fourth part to my beloved son
Archibald Campbell, one fourth part to my beloved son James Campbell, one fourth part
to my beloved nephew Edward Edwards & one fourth part to Lavin Covey.

Lastly I constitute & appoint my worthy friends Lavin Covey & Abraham
Peoples Executors of this my last will & Testament.

In witness of the things herein contained I have set my hand & seal this
fourth day of July & in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred & five.
