In the name of God amen. I, Mary Covey, widow of the County of Boone and State of North Carolina, willing to avoid the mortality of men and women and that it is allotted for all men to die do make and ordain this my last will and Testament in manner and form following, wits:

First. I desire to be buried in a decent Christian like manner.

Second. I will that all my just debts and funeral charges be paid.

Third. I leave and bequeath my part of the waggon to Havel Sapp.

Fourth. I leave and bequeath one little chest or box with wooden hinges and one bushel of my wearing apparel to my daughter Sarah Sapp.

Fifth. I leave and bequeath all the remaining part of my wearing apparel to my sister Elizabeth Sapp if she survives me and if not to her two daughters to be equally divided.

Sixth. I leave and bequeath all the remaining part of my estate to be equally divided between my two sons and sister Elizabeth.

Seventh. I do hereby constitute, nominate and appoint my two brothers Martin Sapp and Martin Sapp executors and administrators of this my last will and Testament.

Eighth. I witness above have signed set my hand and caused my seal to be annexed this 2nd day of the sixth month, A.D. 1799.
