I give to my beloved son Samuels Dodson, One Chest with two drawers, the
 Quaker plates One bag dozen of fluster spoons, & two Chairs.

To my beloved son Richard Dodson, I give my Clock & Case, One pair of
 Statuarts One Candle lantern, & all my deeper furniture, except
 what is above mentioned & disposed of with my Cupboard, also my
 bowls & Sops, two pots, two Cans, & One Skillet, two Chairs, One Coffee
 Mill, One looking Glass, One Flax Wheel, & all my Hogs & Swine,
 all my Farming tools, my Horse & Cart, One cow & five pigs, Sheeps
 & lambs & few dogs,

To my beloved Grand Daughter Martha Rice, I give One Chest without feet, all my
 wearing apparel, & One Cotton Wheel with a pair of Cards Cotton, & One of
 Work Cards

I hereby appoint my son Richard Dodson my Executor to this my last Will
 & Testament disclaiming all others. In Witness my hand & seal this
 the 19th of June A.D. 1832.
