In the name of God amen. I Matthew Price of Stamance Settlement Guilford County & of North Carolina being weak of body but of sound mind and memory do hereby declare for all his purposes & knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die do make & ordain this to be my last will & testament - principally and first of all I recommend my soul into the mighty hand of God who gave it, and my body I recommend to the earth to be buried in a decent Christian manner to the discretion of my Executors, and as touching such worldly goods as it hath pleased God to bestow upon me in this life I demise & bequeath in the following manner & form after my just debts are all paid.

First I give and bequeath to my dearly beloved wife Mary Price the house I now live in and the one third part of my land during her life also the one third of all the cows, her clothes and furniture likewise one third part of all my other household furniture which is to be at her own disposal at her death the land only excepted & to my son Thomas I give & bequeath the sum of five shillings.

Item I bequeath to son-in-law Samuel Flemming five shillings.

Item I give & bequeath to my daughter Nancy Cannon the one third part of my land & all the stock & improvements which she now lives to her & heirs for ever.

Item I give & bequeath to daughter Elleanor the other third part of my land & all the stock & improvements which she now lives to her & heirs for ever. I give all to the aforesaid Elleanor the waggon and sheaves I receive for the use of the plantation & all ploughs hoes & other implements of husbandry that I possess I leave in common for the use of the plantation; also at all times when my wife wants to ride she shall be furnished with

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I give & bequeath to son-in-law Samuel Cunningham five shillings

I give & bequeath to my daughter Nancy Kannon the one third part of my
estate in the house & improvements where she now lives to her & heirs for ever

I give & bequeath to daughter Eleanor the other third part of my land
lying to my dwelling house also at the death of my wife Mary her third is to fall into the hands
of my son-in-law - likewise all the remaining part of my stock of cows horses hogs sheep & household furni-
ture I give all to the aforesaid Eleanor the waggon and chains I leave for the use of the plantation
upon all ploughs hoes & other implements of husbandry that I possess I leave in common for
the use of the plantation; also at all times when my wife wants to ride she shall be furnished with
a horse by my daughter Eleanor

I also constitute Thomas Hamilton of Buffloe & Thomas Greer my whole sole Executors
of my last will and testament - revoking & disannulling all former wills declaring this &
this to be my last will and testament.
