First I give and bequeath unto my son Samuel and my daughter Martha all my husband's premises whereon I now live to be equally divided between them

I also give and bequeath unto each of my other sons and daughters the sum of one dollar each and as touching my money and moveable estate I leave to be equally divided between my son Samuel and daughter Martha whom I also appoint my Executor and Executrix ratifying and confirming this to be my last will and testament.

In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the 14th day of the fourth month in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred & ninety nine.
