 That I Give and my Soul to the hand of God who send it to Rest from all sin by the blood of Christ and my body to the dust to be decently buried at the discretion of my Executors nothing doubting but I shall receive the same again at the General resurrection by the Mighty power of God. Secondly I Give and bequeath unto my beloved Wife Margaret New the room and fire place in the West end of the House and fire Irons and as much of the Kitchen Lard as may be deemed sufficient to maintain her and her two Horses and flock of brats and Hens & Chickens and if she find it necessary she may sell them and buy another. I allow and sell & Charitable of not sold to go my daughter Polly Children & of sold and another purchased that to go them at the death of my wife Margaret. The following property I Give her as her own to be disposed of as she may. Chaise In hand of the Town and Guy Mow & Give, Broom and book band Bed and furnished a Chest & Chiffboard and half the furniture half the Kitchen furniture four Chairs spinning wheel large wheel Clock two Cows and Calf & two young ones four sheep four Hogs a sow & pigs the looking Glass Fire Shovel and Tongs and Jiffy Collar and Tiedor Collar to be paid her annually out of the share of my personal property—

Thirdly I Give and bequeath unto my son Samuel New my books accounts against him amounting to Four hundred and four ten Dollars fifty nine cents and one hundred Dollars to be paid him by his Nathaniel New out of his Share—

Fourthly I Give and bequeath unto my daughter Peggy Gilbreath and her children Henrys Girls named Jane which I Lent her when she removed from Guilford to North Carolina and one hundred Dollars to be paid her by my son Nathaniel New to be paid out

For all that I do to make and constitute my last will and
said Testament in Manner and Form following: **First**
I Give and my soul to the hand of God who sendeth his
Redeemer from all sin by the blood of Christ and my body
to the dust to be decently buried at the discretion of my
Executors nothing doubting but I shall receive the same
again at the General resurrection by the mighty power of
God. Secondly I Give and bequeath unto my beloved Wife
Margaret Her the room and fire place in the West end
of the House and fire Iron and as much of the Floor
Laid as may be deemed sufficient to maintain Her and
Her two Boys and Stock of beasts and Hells & Charcoal
and if She find it necessary She may sell them and buy
another. I allow ~~and~~ Nell Charlotte if not Peter to go my
daughter Polly Children & of sold and another purchased
that to go them at the death of my wife Margaret. The following
property I Give Her as Her own to be disposed of as She may.
Good Linen of the Town and Guy Plow & Guns Bonnet
and book band Red and Green and a Chest & Cupboard
and half do furniture Half the Kitchen furniture four
Chairs Spinning Wheel Large Wheel Clock Two Cows and
Calves & two young ones four sheep four Hogs a sow & pigs
the Looking Glass Fire Shovel and Tongs and Jiffy Collar
and Twelve Dollars to be paid Her annually out of the what
of my personal property —
Thirdly I Give and bequeath unto my son Samuel Her
my book accounts against Her account to Peter
Gordon and four hundred Dollars Jiffy new boots and one
hundred Dollars to be paid Him by the Nathaniel Steer
out of His Part.

Fourthly I Give and bequeath unto my daughter Peggy Gilbert
and Her children Henrys Girl named Jane what
I Lent Her when She removed from Guilford on
about barrow and one hundred Dollars to be
paid by my son William Her to be laid out
on the Education of said Peggy's children
the said one hundred Dollars to be paid

To Interest and equally divided among them the sum also to
 receive their Education between twelve and fifteen years of
 age and the moneys between fifteen & eighteen I also allow
 my Executors to pay one Hundred Dollars out on Interest
 to the Interest but annually for the benefit of Mr. Peggy
 Gilbreath and her Children during her life & at her
 death to be equally divided amongst all her Children -

5th I Give and bequeath unto my Son William that my
 Book accounts against him amounting to two Hundred
 & fifty Three Dollars and two Cents and with the Interest
 paid on it one Hundred Dollars 33 Cents the other with
 the Int. paid Twenty Two Dollars 10 Cents and a Negro
 boy named Bob. said William to pay the Children of
 Peggy Gilbreath one Hundred Dollars as before Directed

6th I Give and bequeath unto my Daughter Polly McLean
 all the property Real and Personal which she had
 now in possession Consisting of House hold Furniture
 Kitchen Furniture Lawn Mow the Land as before divided

7th I Give and bequeath unto my Son James that my book
 acct. and Receipts in my possession amounting to two
 Hundred and fifty four Dollars 25 Cents and Twenty
 Dollars to be paid him by my Son Nathaniel that part

8th I Give and bequeath unto my Son Nathaniel that my book
 accounts against him amounting to One Thousand and
 Twenty Two Dollars the Part of the Land as laid off
 to him to pay my son James Twenty Dollars

9th My Out plantation I allow to be sold & the price
 with notes and book accounts & what may be sold
 my Personal Estate & property Equally Divided among all
 my Children -

10th If Will & Charlot. Should live in the Family and
 become a charge I allow all my Children to help
 to maintain them -

Lastly I constitute and appoint Eliza Wharton and my
 Son James that Executors of this my last Will
 and Testament. Constituted the said

5th I Gave and Signath unto my Son William that my
Brod account against him amounting to two Hundred
& Fifty Three Dollars and Two Shos one with the Interest
paid on it one Hundred Dollars 33 Cents the other with
the Int. paid Twenty Two Dollars 10 Cents and a Negro
boy named Bob said William to pay the children of
Hoggy Gilbreath one Hundred Dollars as before Directed

7th. I Give and Acqueth unto my Son James Bar my book
accl. and Receipt in my possession amounting to Six
Hundred and Fifty four Dollars 9^{cts}. and Twenty
Dollars to be paid him by my Son Nathaniel Bar. Out of
his part

9th My out plantation I allow to be sold & the price with notes and book accounts & whatever may be sold my personal Estate property Equally Divided among all my Children —

Lastly I constitute and appoint Eliza Wharton and my
Son Samuel their Executors of this my last Will
and Testament. Constituting this and this only to be
my last Will and Testament acknowledged Signed
Sealed & Published this 22 of October 1873.

I Samuel Simmons of the County of Guilford in the State of North Carolina being weak of body but sound of mind & memory Calling to mind the mortality of my body & knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die; do make & ordain this my last Will & Testament in manner & form as follows: Viz first & principally of all I recommend my Soul to God who gave it, & my body to the dust to be buried in a decent Christian burial not doubting but that I shall receive the same again by the almighty power of God. — at the General Resurrection.

And as touching my Worldly Estate, which it has pleased God to bless me with, in this life, I Will & devise in the following manner.

- 1st I will & devise to my three sons Thomas, John, & William Simmons, the Land I have heretofore given them, for which they have settled, also all their other property.
- 2^d I will & devise unto my three sons Samuel, Robert, & James Simmons the remainder or other half of Land to be equally divided among them & I hereby Order & direct my Executors with one other person by him chosen to make such a division, as will be just & equitable among them. — I also Will & devise unto them they unto Samuel a note on A Russell for forty three Dollars, & Twenty one Dollars I have heretofore given him to make him up in price of a horse Cattle, & I will & give to my son Robert a young bay Mare, & to my son James a young black Horse.
