- 5th I give and bequeath to Elijah Brazil Three head of hogs, one barrow & two sows
I give and bequeath to Est. Brazil and Pleasant Brazil & James Brazil One
pig each.
- I also give to Elijah Brazil's Children the plate of Cups & Saucers
I also give to Elijah Brazil one Dollar one Nathaniel Sampson, One Dollar one
William Brown Fifty Cents one William Sampson
A quantity of Corn if not fed away to the hogs, I want it sold also one
barrow & sows of Corn at John Price
