at the time of my decease and the sum of One Hhundred & Sixty shillings
which am called them at present my wife & others say being That my said
daughter had above mentioned to be part of her portion of the said summe
which am called them particularly after my decease & that the sum of the Valley
to paid to each of them by my executors as soon as may be agreeable to the
said Mary my wife And by this my last Will & Testament.

I also give and bequeath to my sister Mrs Elizabeth Thompson the sume of four shillings
I also give and bequeath to my beloved son Richard Thompson the like sume of four shillings.

I also give and bequeath to my beloved son John Thompson all the sume of two shillings
which am called One hundred & Sixty shillings to be the same more
or less & also also for from and to him the right & title to a sume of money
which I have heneate given him.

The residue of the Estate I desire to be sold & after discharging all my
just Debts and settling all the foregoing bequests out of the Prencipal sum
the balance of any shillings remaing of the amount of such sale.

I wish & ordaine that to my wife Elizabeth a sume of One hundred & Sixty shillings

One hundred & Sixty Pounds to her. Make & Ordain this my last Will
Instrument, in the manner following and bear date
First I desire unto God that all my just debt alibi White may stand at the
time of my decease to stand and discharge it so speedily as the pecuniary
sum alibi made will satisfy my Executor or to deny unto his touching
the estate wherewithal to make payment so to this in this life I have
lived and desirous of to the manner following.

I give and bequeath to my dear beloved daughter Margaret Ann Potts One feather
bed and furniture the same that is at present and by her husband now
called her to my family with all such furniture as may then stand in the
time at the time of my decease also One Wardrobe Chest with a Draw and
the sum of Ninety Dollars to be divided one hundred feet of my Estate.

I also give and bequeath to my dear beloved daughter Margaret Ann Potts One
feather bed and furniture with her that may appear standing at the time
of my decease the bed being the same which is at present called by her the
name of the Coffey.

I also give and bequeath to each of my four children, namely, Francis
Elizabeth & Sarah Ann Potts the feather bed and all the furniture therein belonging
at the time of my decease and the sum of Ten Dollars the beds being the same
which are called them at present my wife & myself being then my said
daughter lost above mentioned & also to be paid in proportion of the beds & furniture
which are called them respectively after we deceased that the sum of Ten Dollars
be paid to each of them by my executors as soon as may be agreeable to the
said executors and subject to this my last Will & Testament.

I also give and bequeath to my beloved son Robert Potts the like sum of ten Dollars
I also give and bequeath to my beloved son Robert Potts all the sum of Sandow which
I now have outstanding One Hundred & Sixty Pounds to be the same more
or less so also also fees from him to him the right & title to a small house
which I have hitherto given him.

The residue of this Estate I desire to be sold off after discharging all my
just debts and settling all the pecuniary bequests out of the proceeds thereof
the balance of my estate remaining the amount of such sale
I wish & desire that it be equally divided among my dear daughters herein
before mentioned during the life time of one last above mentioned &
and I do nominate as joint & co-trustees my dear daughters herein
