I Amos Mendell of the County of Guilford and State of North
Carolina being of sound mind and memory the weak in body
and calling to mind the mortality of the body do make and Ordain
that my last will and testament be in manner and form following.
First I bequeath my Soul to God who gave it and my body to the dust
from whence it came to be buried in a Christian and decent
like manner at the discretion of my Executors—
Next I will that my Executors sell as much of my personal Estate as
will pay off all my Just Debts.
3rd I will and bequeath to my beloved wife Margaret Stewart my
Plantation I now live on during her natural life for her support
and that of the family while they live with her I also will to my
beloved wife my black girl during her natural life.

- I also will to her My Mare & Doe and My Cattle Sheep and hogs except one Cow Claimed by My Daughter Patsy.
- I also will to my wife One Bed and furniture My Chest and Chest of Drawers the Corner Cupboard and its furniture and one Chest and all the Household & Kitchen furniture.
- I also will that My farming tools & gear remain on the Plantation for the use of My wife and family.
- I also will that My Smith tools remain on the place for the use of the family altho I reserve of them at least the right as herein after mentioned.
- I also will all My Books the 6 volumes of the Encyclopedia Americana to My wife during her natural life to be disposed of as herein after mentioned.
- I also will My wife one years allowance for her and family of what May be on hand at my death or growing.
- 3^d I will & Bequeath My Beloved Daughter Prudence Altho by her Husband John then one dollar.
- 4th I will & Bequeath My son Sam^l Stewart one Dollar
- 5th I will & Bequeath to My Beloved Son William Stewart one Dollar.
- 6th I will & Bequeath to My Beloved Daughter Jennell Pth with her Husband one Dollar.
- 7th I will & Bequeath to my beloved son David C Stewart one half of My Smith tools only they are to remain on the Place where my wife lives.
- I also will to My son David My Negro Boy named Sam by his paying One dollar to the American Missionary Society within five years after My death.
10. I will & Bequeath to my Daughter Martha Stewart the Cow she now claims One Bed & furniture also the Mare and Saddle she now claims by the Bureau is at Sam^l Pths Sale by my Negro Girl named Nuckama by her paying to the American Bible Society Ten Dollars within five years after My Death.
11. I will & Bequeath to my Beloved son Albert Stewart one half of My Smith tools and My wife at death all my farming tools & gear & My old wagon and the Plantation where I live at.

and all the Household & Kitchen furniture.

I also will that my farming tools & grass remain on the Plantation for the use of my wife and family.

I also will that my Smith tools remain on the place for the use of the family, altho I dispose of them at least the right as herein after mentioned.

I also will all my Books the 6 Volumes of the Encyclopaedia Americana to my wife during her natural life to be disposed of as herein after mentioned.

I also will my wife one years allowance for her and family of what may be on hand at my death or growing.

5th I will & Bequeath my Beloved Daughter Prudence Altho of her Husband John then one dollar.

6th I will & Bequeath my son Sam^l Stewart One Dollar

7th I will & Bequeath to my Beloved son Jacob Stewart One Dollar.

8th I will & Bequeath to my Beloved Daughter Fennell Polk and her Husband One Dollar.

9th I will & Bequeath to my beloved son David C Stewart one half of my Smith tools only they are to remain on the Place where my wife lives.

I also will to my son David my Negro Boy named Sam by his paying Ten dollars to the American Missionary Society within Six weeks after my death.

10th I will & Bequeath to my Daughter Martha Stewart the Cow she now claims & Bed of furniture also the Mare and Saddle she now claims of the Bureau sold at James Polks sale of my Negro Girl named Annama by his paying to the American Bible Society Ten Dollars within Six years after my Death.

11th I will & Bequeath to my Beloved son David Stewart one half of my Smith tools and my wife at death all my farming tools & Grass of my old Wagon and the Plantation I now live on at my wife's death and the Horse & Saddle he now possesses and one Bed of furniture I also give him my Black Girl named Beck I also give him my Black Girl named Ruth at my wife's death I also will that my son Robert stay on the Plantation

and take care of his Mother if she here will need it, in I also
 will him my Clock & kind of Graces to be made to be made
 held by his furniture of his board furniture at my house
 I also will him my son & that power I will that he pay to the
 Communion of the Alliance Congregation for the use of
 Congregation Twenty Dollars within Two years after my Death
 I will that my three Children David Martha & Robert Stewart have
 My best coat, Brown, white, white among them,
 It is also my will that my wife Dispose of her Death all the books
 belong to her among the three last named Children.
 Lastly it is my will that my Executors sell all my Estate not bound
 in my will for the purpose of paying off my Debt. And
 I do hereby revoke all other will and Testaments of mine by which I
 have made my last will and Testament, and further I do
 nominate and appoint my three sons (David & Stewart
 and Robert Stewart) Executors to execute this my last will
 & Testament,

 mind & memory & being fully advised do this eighth day of
 June in the Year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred
 & thirty three make and publish this my last will & testament
 in the manner following, that is to say,

I give & bequeath unto my Francisson Greenville Lamar
 & Martin Lloyd Higgins the tract of land on which I now
 live containing one hundred & twenty five acres to be divided
 equally between them by an east and west line My Daughter
 Elizabeth Lamar then to make choice of the northern or Southern
 Division for her own use & the other to go to Martin L. Higgins that part however
 that may be chosen for Greenville by her Mother is to remain
 in her possession and the profits arising therefrom To go to her
 until she and benefit while she remains in her present destitute
 & desolate situation, But should she connect herself to any
 man & live with him as his wife she forfeits the whole of
 the bequest bequeathed to her above should her Husband
 James Lamar or whosoever deprive her of the benefits of the
 above bequest then my Francisson and Martin Lloyd Higgins
 Greenville Lamar is to take the entire possession of the land
 and out of the profits arising therefrom To give her Mother a
 decent support as long as she may think proper to remain
 on the land
