I also will that my Smith tools remain on the place for the use of the family altho I dispose of them at least the right as herein after mentioned.

I also will all my Books the 6 Volumes of the Encyclopedica Americana to my wife during her natural life to be disposed of as herein after mentioned.

I also will My wife one years allowance for her and family of what may be on hand at my death or growing.

5th I will & Bequeath My Beloved Daughter Prudence Altho by her Husband John then one dollar.

6th I will & Bequeath My son Sam^l Stewart One Dollar

7th I will & Bequeath to My Beloved son Jacob Stewart one Dollar.

8th I will & Bequeath to My Beloved Daughter Fennell Polk one dollar to her Husband, One Dollar.

9th I will & Bequeath to my beloved son David C Stewart one half of my Smith tools only they are to remain on the Place where my wife lives.

I also will to my son David my Negro Boy named Green by his paying Ten dollars to the American Missionary Society within Six weeks after my death.

10th I will & Bequeath to my Daughter Martha Stewart the Cow she now claims & Bed of furniture also the Mare and Saddle she now claims of the Bureau sold at James Polks sale of my Negro Girl named Annama by her paying to the American Bible Society Ten Dollars within Six years after my Death.

11th I will & Bequeath to my Beloved son Percit Stewart one half of my Smith tools and my wife death all my farming tools & Grass & my old Wagon and the Plantation & note live on at my wife death and the Horse & Saddle he now claims and one Bed of Furniture I also give him my Black Girl named Beck I also give him my Black Girl named Ruth at my wife death I also will that My son Robert stay on the Plantation

and take care of his Mother by see her well provided for I also
 will him My Clock & Chair of Grace & to learn his stewardship
 hold by his furniture of his board furniture at my house with
 I also will him My Gun & what powder I will that he pay to the
 Communion of the Alliance Congregation for the use of
 Congregation Twenty Dollars within Two years after my Death
 I will that My three Children David Martha & Robert Stewart have
 My Debt call, & down I will divide among them,
 It is also My will that My wife Desires at her Death all the books
 belong to her among the three last named Children.
 Lastly it is My will that My Executors viz all my Estate not before
 in My will for the purpose of paying off my Debts & that
 I do hereby revoke all other will and Testaments of mine by or established
 to be my last will and Testament, and further I do
 nominate and appoint My three Sons (David Stewart
 and Robert Stewart Executors to execute the My last will
 & Testament)

 American Bible Society. My Son Robert \$20. to the
 Communion of the Alliance Congregation

& thirty three make and publish this my last will & testament
in the manner following, that is to say

I give & bequeath unto Mr. Francis Greenwell Lamar
& Maria, Legit. Daughters the tract of land on which I now
live containing one hundred & twenty five acres to be divided
equally between them by an east and west line My Daughter
Elizabeth Lamar then to make Choice of the northern or Southern
Part for her own Residence & the other she may choose to
be reserved and the other to go to Maria H. Higgins that part however
that may be chosen for Greenwell by his Mother is to remain
in her possession and the profits arising therefrom to go to her
until she and benefit while she remains in her present destitute
& desolate situation, But should she connect herself to any
man & live with him as his wife she forfeits the whole of
the benefits bequeathed to her above should her Husband
James Lamar & heirs deprive her of the benefits of the
above bequest then my executors are authorized and he or
Greenwell Lamar is to take the entire possession of the land
and out of the profits arising therefrom to give his Mother a
decent support as long as she may think proper to remain
on the land
