

The contents of the Will of Samuel Allison

First all my Just Bills to be paid

2^d I will & bequeath to my Beloved Wife Elizabeth her living & maintenance on the plantation I disposed of with One Horse & Saddle & Two Cows my Stock of Sheep & Hogs with all the household & Kitchen furniture beds bedding & Other Articles to be for her use & the family During her life or Widowhood

I will to Daughter Sally Weatherly Ten Dollars

And to her Son Billy five Dollars

To Anne Alknight Ten Dollars & to her son Samuel Washington five Dollars

And to Becky Finley Ten Dollars & to her Daughter Betsy five Dollars

To my son John & Arthur I leave my Mill & plantation & my Negro boys Sam & Wray to be Equally Divided between them together with all Other Articles that they may Consider Necessary for their use & One Hundred Dollars in Cash that I will to be Paid Out for the purchase of a Good Brood Mare for the benefit of both the Aforesaid said Boys with this Injunction that they pay the Above Legates the money that is owed to them
