Second I will and bequeath unto my wife Ruth Carter all my stock of Horses cattle hogs & sheep and all my house hold and Kitchen furniture with my farming tools and all my property not hereafter disposed of during her lifetime or widowhood and it is further my will that when she ceases to be my widow that my son Isaac Carter shall have all the property willed to her in this clause in as much as I depend on him to take care and support myself & my wife Ruth during our lives.

Third I give and bequeath unto my daughter Anderson one dollar having before given her what I intended her to have.

Fourth I give and bequeath unto my son John Carter one dollar having before given him what I intended him to have.

Fifth I give and bequeath unto my daughter Ann Haggart one dollar having before given her what I intended her to have.

Sixth I give and bequeath unto my daughter Mary Haggart one dollar having before

Fifth I give and bequeath unto my son John Carter one dollar having before given him what I intended him to have

Sixth I give and bequeath unto my daughter Ann Hoggatt one dollar having before given her what I intended her to have

Seventh I give and bequeath unto my daughter Mary Melton one dollar having before given her what I intended her to have

Eighth I give and bequeath unto my son Nicholas Carter one dollar having already given him what I intended him to have

Ninth It is my will that all my just debts be paid and that such articles as can most conveniently be spared be sold for that purpose as well as to pay the expenses of my last illness and it is my will that my son Isaac shall have my Smith of my death, ninth I hereby ordain and appoint my son John Carter Nicholas Carter my executor to the my last will and testament
