First after bequeathing my Soul will return to God, I wish my body to be buried in a decent and Christian like Manner, all my Personal Charges & other Bills to be promptly paid.

First, I will & bequeath unto my beloved wife all my Lands & Negroes and all my other Personal Estate, whatsoever to be at her entire disposal during her widowhood except what I otherwise dispose of in this Will.

And if my Wife should die my Will is without having or making a Will to dispose of the Estate that may be in her Possession then & in that case the Estate of what may be to be divided equally among my Children namely Hannah Swamy, Abner Swamy, Peter Sw., Viper Swamy, James Brown, Fimmas Swamy, Betsy Swamy and if my said Wife have any more Sons I would think proper to give or dispose or distribute any of the said estate either real or Personal to any of my now Children that she be at liberty to do the same and I bequeath to my daughter Susanna One Dollar, Also I will to my Daughter Lydia Biondo One Dollar, Also I will to Jane Jones one Dollar I also will to the Children of Mary Gellie One Dollar to be equal among them, I will to my Daughter Anne Jones One Dollar, I also give to my son Samuel Swamy One Dollar.

Lastly I appoint my Wife beloved Wife Anne Swamy & my sons Abner Swamy & Viper Swamy to be my whole & sole Executors to this my Last Will & Testament in testimony whereof I have hereunto affixed my hand & seal this 24th day of June in the year of our Lord One Thousand Eight Hundred & twenty five.

I also will to the Children of Mary Goble One Acre to be equal
among them, I will to my Daughter Ann Swinney One Acre, I also
give to my son Samuel Swinney One Acre.

Lastly I appoint my Wife beloved Wife Ann Swinney & my son Anne Swinney
& Veper Swinney to be my whole & sole Executors to this my Last Will
& Testament - In testimony whereof I have hereunto affixed my hands
& seal this 24 day of June in the year of our said One Thousand Eight
Hundred & twenty five.

dis possess of and all my personal property not other wise disposed of.

Item 10 I do hereby nominate & appoint my sister Nancy Lane my whole

sole Executor to this my Last Will & Testament.
