I do give and bequeath unto my Wife Maria Fuller the House
hold & Tract of Land On which I now live during her Natural
Life, with all ^{such} Necessaries about the House & I do not assign as the same
Stand in need of ^{having her life time also one house built upon the plantation} and two Horses as the most Valuable
Arising from the improvements or rents of the Aforesaid Plantation
also my Negro Woman Eliza to Wait on her during
Life time & bid furniture to be at her own disposal at her desire
And I do also will to my Grand son James Gaffey Fullon One
Lorse bridle & Saddle to be worth the value of Eighty
Dollars After all my just debts be paid and my wife
Maria Fullon having a Good & Sufficient Support from
the Rent Arising yearly from the Aforesaid Plantation
The Surplus Money to be Equally divided yearly Between my
two Daughters Jane & Mary Weatherly I will to my Daughter
Jane Weatherly all the West Side of the Tract of Land & Plantation
On which I now live, The Gum Branch to be the line the Meadow
excepted During her life time and at her decease I will that that
the Aforesaid Land & Improvements be to her Children.

I will to my Daughter Maria Weatherly all the Land Dwelling
house & improvements On the East Side of the Aforesaid Gum
Branch being the House & Plantation where I now live during her
life time & at the decease of me and my wife I will that she
have Peaceable Possession of the said Land & premises during
her life and after decease I will that the Aforesaid Land &
Improvements be to her Children.

I will that my Son Alexander Fullon have my Negro Woman
Eliza As his Own Servt & Property at the decease of myself &
wife Maria Fullon I will to my Son Samuel Fullon a negro
boy named Isaac six years old; & to my Son Thomas Fullon
a negro boy named Jacob. four years old, & to my Son James
Fullon a negro boy named Isaac four years old. I will to
my Son George Fullon a negro boy named Abraham six years
old. I do appoint William Weatherly of Alexander Fullon
& Andrew Weatherly the my last Will & Testament as my true
testament.

I do give and bequeath unto my Wife Mary Tullow the Household & Tract of Land On which I now live during her Natural Life, with all Necessaries about the House & place of abode as she may stand in need of ^{having her life long also one horse harnisched & the Houghing & Carting of her two children & the same to be kept up by the said wife & husband} & all the Profits Arising from the improvements or rents of the Aforesaid Plantation also my Negro Woman Elly to wait on her during her life time & furniture to be left her own disposal at her desire And I do also will to my Grand son James Gaffey Tullow One Horse bridle & saddle to be worth the value of Eighty Dollars After all my just debts be paid and my Wife Mary Tullow having a good & sufficient support from the rents Arising yearly from the Aforesaid Plantation The surplus Money to be equally divided yearly between my two Daughters Jane & Mary Weatherly I will to my Daughter Jane Weatherly all the West Side of the Tract of Land & Plantation One Which I now live, The Gum branch to be the line the Meadow excepted During her life time and at her decease I will that that the Aforesaid Land & Improvements be to her Children. —
I will to my Daughter Mary Weatherly all the Land & building house & improvements On the East Side of the Aforesaid Gum branch being the House & Plantation Where I now live during her life time & at the decease of me and my Wife I will that she have Peaceable Possession of the said Land & premises during her life and after decease I will that the Aforesaid Land & Improvements be to her Children.

I Will that my Son Alexander Fullon have my Negro Woman
• Cling As his Own Right & Property, at the Death of myself &
Wife Mary Fullon I will to my Son Samuel Fullon a negro
boy named Isaac six years old; & to my Son Thomas Fullon
a negro boy named Jacob ten years old, & to my Son James
Fullon a negro boy named Isaac four years old. I will to
my Son George Fullon A negro boy named Abraham six years
old. I do appoint William Weatherly & Alexander Fullon
& Andrew Weatherly the my last Will & Testament as Executors
to act for me & my children according to this my last Will

of body that the surviving brother or brothers shall have their legacy or legacy
so due to them & their heirs forever I bequeath the above mentioned legacy
to my three above named Grandsons in place of Land Property —
Item the part of land that my son Thomas Russey have had laid off &
he formerly occupied I have Conveyed away & he has received a full Me-
ward for the same in Order to clear the said Thomas Russey of his just debts
Item I Give & bequeath unto my three aforesaid Grandsons Jonathan Henry
and Joseph each an iron pot my largest pot to Jonathan my next largest
to Henry & my next largest to Joseph to them & their heirs forever
Item I give & bequeath unto my son Thomas Russey
