Arising from the improvements or Rents of the Aforesaid Plan-

tation also my Negro Woman Milly to Wait on her during
life time And furniture to be set at her own disposal at her death.

And I do also will to my Grand son James Cassius Tutton One
Horn best bridle & Saddle to be Worth the value of Eighty
Dollars After all my Just debts be paid and my Wife

Mary Tutton having a Good & Sufficient Support from
the Rents Arising yearly from the Aforesaid Plantation
The Surplus Money to be Equally divided yearly Between my

Two Daughters Jane & Mary Weatherly. I will to my Daughter
Jane Weatherly all the West Side of the Tract of Land & Plantation
One Which I now live, The Gum branch to be the line the meadow

excepted during her life time and at her decease I Will that that
the Aforesaid Land & Improvements be to her Children.

I Will to my Daughter Mary Weatherly all the Land & dwelling
house & Improvements. On the East Side of the Aforesaid Gum
branch being the House & Plantation Where I now live during her

life time & at the decease of me and my Wife I will that she
have the sole possession of the said Land & Improvements during
her life and after decease I Will that the Aforesaid Land &
Improvements be to her Children.

I Will that my Son Alexander Tutton have my Negro Woman
Milly Ashes Own right & property, at the decease of myself &
Wife Mary Tutton I will to my Son Samuel Tutton a negro

boy named Isaac six years old; & to my Son Thomas Tutton
a Negro boy named Jacob, ten years old, & to my son James
Tutton a Negro boy named Isaac four years old. I will to

my son George Tutton a negro boy named Abraham six years
old. I do appoint William Weatherly & Alexander Tutton
& Andrew Weatherly this my last will & Testament.

1st I do give and bequeath unto my Wife Mary Tullon the House hold & Tract of Land On Which I now live during her Natural Life, with all ^{such} Necessaries About the House ^{as she may stand in need of during her life time also one house, heart, such as the said Mary Tullon} And all the profits Arising from the improvements or Rents of the Aforesaid Plantation also my Negro Woman Mitty to Wait on her during her life time And furniture to be set at her own disposal at her decease And I do also will to my Grand son James Cassius Tullon One Horse best bridle & Saddle to be Worth the value of Eighty Dollars After all my Just debts be paid and my Wife Mary Tullon having a Good & Sufficient Support from the Rents Arising yearly from the Aforesaid Plantation

The Surplus Money to be Equally divided yearly between my two Daughters Jane & Mary Weatherly. I will to my Daughter Jane Weatherly all the West Side of the Tract of Land & Plantation One Which I now live, The Gum branch to be the line the meadow Excepted during her life time and at her decease I Will that that the Aforesaid Land & Improvements be to her Children.

I Will to my Daughter Mary Weatherly all the Land & dwelling house & Improvements On the East Side of the Aforesaid Gum branch being the House & Plantation Where I now live during her life time & at the decease of me and my Wife I will that she have a perfect Description of the said Land & Improvements during her life and after decease I Will that the Aforesaid Land & Improvements be to her Children.

I Will that my Son Alexander Tullon have my Negro Woman Mitty Ashes Own right & property, at the decease of myself & Wife Mary Tullon I will to my Son Samuel Tullon a negro boy named Isaac six years old; & to my Son Thomas Tullon a Negro boy named Jacob ten years old, & to my son James Tullon a Negro boy named Isaac four years old. I Will to my Son George Tullon A negro boy named Abraham six years old. I do appoint William Weatherly & Alexander Tullon & Andrew Weatherly then my last will & Testament as Executors to act for me & my children according to this my last will & Testament. Then I Give and bequeath unto my three Grandsons namely Jonathan Henry & Joseph (sons of my beloved son John Hussey deceased) Five Hundred Dollars to Each of them Which said several Legacies or Sums of money I Will & Order to be paid to the said Respective Legatee when they arrive at the age of Twenty One year Old and it is my Will & meaning that if Either of my Aforesaid Grandsons or any of them should die in minority or Without heir of body that the Surviving brother or brothers shall have their Legacy or legacies to be devolved to them & their heirs forever I bequeath the Above mentioned Legacies to my three Above named Grandsons in place of Land properly —

Item the Part of Land that my Son Thomas Hussey have had paid off & he formerly Occupied I have conveyed away & he has Received a full Award for the Same in Order to Clear the said Thomas Hussey of his Just Ditts

Then I Give & bequeath unto my three Aforesaid Grandsons Jonathan Henry and Joseph Each an Iron pot my Largest pot to Jonathan my next largest to Henry & my next Largest to Joseph to them & their heirs forever
