Item I Give to my daughter Polly Hordell Ten Dollars

Item I Give to my daughter Ruth Low Ten Dollars

Item I Give to my son George my Rifle Gun

Item I Give all my Lands to be equally divided between my Six Sons Namely Abel Samuel George John & Robert & James Irwin & after my death for my Sons to divide the Land themselves but if they cant agree in the division then for them to Opoinit Two suitable persons to divide the Land for them and after divided each One to have the pcedidge of Occupying their Own Share. Except so much of Said Land as is hereifore mentioned they are not to have until after the death my widow.

Also I Opoinit & Ordain my Six Sons Abel ~~Irwin~~ & John Irwin Executor of this my Last Will & Testament. In Witness I Samuel Irwin the Statator of this my Last Will & Testament, I have set my hand & Seal the day <sup>being</sup> & Year Above writtin

2<sup>d</sup> I will & bequeath to my Beloved Wife Elizabeth her living & maintenance on the plantation I disposed of with One Horse & Saddle & Two Cows my Stock of Sheep & Hogs with all the household & Kitchen furniture beds bedding & Other Articles to be for her use & the family During her life or Widowhood

I Will to Daughter Sally Weatherly Ten Dollars

And to her Son Billy five Dollars.

To Anne Wlknight Ten Dollars & to her son Samuel Washington five Dollars

And to Betsy Finley Ten Dollars & To her Daughter Betsy five Dollars

To my son John & Arthur I leave my Mill & plantation & my Negro boy Sam Wray to be Equally Divided between them together with all the Other Articles that they may Consider Necessary for their use & One Hundred Dollars in Cash that I will to be Paid Out for the purchase of a Good Brood Mare for the benefit of both the Aforesaid Said Boyes With this Injunction that they pay the Above Legates the money that is Owed to them
