And first I will that all my Just Debt be paid
And second I give and bequeath to my brother Joseph Mitchell my houses and lots in Charlotte and also one half of my personal estate and Movable estate after they debts are paid I also will that my friends and many Affected

And third I give and bequeath to my Sister Mary Andrew the balance of my money and estate to be her money her natural life and at her death to be equally divided among all her children
And fourth I give and bequeath to my Son-in-law and faithful friend William C. Thomas my Gold watch

And fifth It is my will and desire that my Executor hereafter appointed give my friend James Hull by monthly instalments after my death upon said Hull's paying up the interest
And lastly I do lastly hereby nominate constitute & appoint my trusty friend James Hull my Executor to this my last will

after my death upon said bonds paying up the same
I do lastly hereby nominate constitute & appoint my trusty
friend William S. Palmer my executor to take my last will
and Testament
