 first I give and bequeath to my Grand Daughter Susanah Levitt one Cow & calf and one bed and furniture also one Chest and two paper basins and one paper dish

Item the second I give and bequeath to my son George Levitt one Cow and calf one paper dish two paper basins one new saddle, one trunk, one bed quilt, one blanket and one shirt, one duck coat, and one bible and one bed bolster

and I do hereby give by Grand daughter Sarah Murdock one six hundred shag but is now in her possession

Item the fourth I give my Grand Daughter Deborah Levitt one Bible

And lastly I will and appoint my sons George Levitt and John Levitt to be my whole and sole executors of this my last will and Testament keeping and allowing what they lawfully do or cause to be done in relation thereto which I have hereunto set my hand and seal August the 6th 1835
