In the Name of God Amen Whereas I Frankfull Woodburn of the County  
of Guilford and State of North Carolina, well knowing the uncertainty of  
life and the Certainty of death and being deceased in body but of  
Sound Mind & Memory, do think proper to have the following Writ  
as my Last Will & Testament. Vinctually & first of all I recommend  
my Soul to God who gave it and my body to the Earth to be buried  
in a decent Manner and as touching such worldly goods.  
First I leave my Negro Man Isaac to be free after he has earned  
Three Hundred Dollars and paid it 30% to my Ex. or Guardian of my  
three Grandsons William Woodburn Wiley Calvin Anderson Wiley David  
Washington Wiley when they come of age, and said Negro is to be sold out.

Annually for what he will fetch and allowing him three suits in the year and two pair of shoes and two pair of stockings & one hat wool. three pair of Overalls three shirts one coat fast wool the hire of my Negro Man Isaac three hundred Dollars to be equally divided between my three Grandsons as they come of age by Williams Woodburn Wiley Calvin Anderson Wiley David Washington Wiley D. My Negro boy Alfred to be hired Annually for what he will fetch and it is my earnest desire that my Exe or Guardian would hire him to men that will use him well & Alfred is to be hired to my first Grandson Comes of age William Woodburn Wiley and the hire of Alfred to go to the use of my Grand Daughter Catharine O Wiley but if my daughter Ann should have one Daughter more I wish the hire of Alfred to be equally divided between the two as they come of age. my boy Alfred shall have three coarse shirts, & four pair of coarse Overalls two pair of shoes two pair of stockings, and one wool hat Annually to come out of his hire one coat fast wool, two West Coats.

3. My household furniture three beds & furniture one chest I leave to my Grand Daughter Catharine Carline Wiley but if my daughter Ann Wiley should have one Daughter more I leave my three beds & furniture & chest to be equally divided between the two as they come of age.

4 I leave to my Daughter Ann Wiley all my wearing apparel. Cupboard & furniture

5. I leave to my son in law David Wiley Five Dollars.

6 I give or leave to my Grandson William Woodburn Wiley my boy Alfred when he comes of age by paying over to his two brothers Calvin Anderson Wiley David Washington Wiley that is to Calvin W. Wiley One third, and David W. Wiley One third of the aforesaid Value, and Alfred shall be valued by two good Freeholders when William Woodburn Wiley comes of age. and so as above mentioned shall pay over to his two brothers Calvin W. Wiley & David W. Wiley One third to each.

7. I leave in the Care of my Daughter Ann Wiley my three beds & furniture & chest like my Grand Daughter Catharine Carline Wiley Comes. of age.

8 I leave all the rest of my property to be sold & my Just debts to be paid out of them and what money I have to be put to the same use and if there is any thing left I leave it David Washington Wiley. - The above is my last will & Testament for which I have set my hand & affixed my Seal this Eleventh Day August in the year of thy Lord One Thousand Eight Hundred Twenty Nine 1829.
