Witnessing & appointed for Mary Dec to die, and I being afflicted in body, but of
sound Mind & Memory, do make this my Last Will & Testament, in the
first place I give my soul to God who gave it & my body to the
dead from whence it came.

I herefore have given to my Well beloved sons William, Benjamin, Manning &
Wiley Brookshire the sum of Three Hundred Dollars to each of them which
I consider their part of my worldly property.

In the next place I give to my Well beloved Wife Mary Brookshire my
Lands on which I live during her widowhood also all my houses
held property, farming Utensils, horse & Carriage, hogs & Cattle for the
same term her widowhood.

At the death of my Wife or her Marriage my Will is that the property
left with her be sold & equally divided between my seven
Daughters Jane Euallens, Margurat Brookshire, Rebecca Manes, Sarah
Nabby, Hannah Hammons, Mary Henry, Oliver Huncannon, & my Wife
Mary Brookshire, Written & Sealed in presence of
