In the Name of God amen I Thomas Dick of the County of
Guilford and State of North Carolina being of a Sound and perfect
Mind and Memory (blessed be God) do this Twelfth day of December
in the Year of our Lord One Thousand eight hundred and Twenty
Make and publish this my Last Will and Testament in manner
following that is to say First I Give and bequeath unto my son John
St. Dick the plantation Wherem I then live containing near One
thousand acres of Land Mills and all that appertains thereto
I Give him also my Negro Man Sam and I Give my son John St.
Dick to take possession of all my Credit and of my slow and pay
my Debt out of them and of any thing left here it is my will
to be divided amongst my Heirs I do Give my son John St. Dick One
Good Horse saddle and Bridle One Bed and Furniture and one half
of my Lib. of Books. Secondly I do Give and Bequeath unto my
Daughter Elizabeth St. Dick my Negro Girl Lucy and her increase
One Good horse bridle & saddle and two Good Beds Furniture
and I Give her also One Good Table One Bedstead Thirdly I do
Give and Bequeath unto my son Thomas St. Dick my appur-
tances and plantation and all that appertains thereto I do also Give
him my Negro man Abram my Negro boy Mister and

Negro Man Frank I do also Give him a Good Horse bridle
 and Saddle One Good Bed and furniture and half my Library
 of Books Fourthly I do Give and bequeath unto my Daughter
 Rebecca Dick my negro Girl Cissy and her increased also one Good
 Horse bridle and Saddle two Good Beds and furniture One Good
 Table and One Chair. Fifthly I do Give and Bequeath unto my
 Daughter Jane & Dick my negro Girl Ethel and her Increased also
 One Good Horse bridle and Saddle two Good Beds and furniture
 & One Good Table and One Chair. Sixthly I do Give and bequeath
 unto Thomas Lindsay son of Andrew Lindsay my negro boy Emanuel.
 Seventhly I do further Give and bequeath unto my son John W.
 Dick my negro man Harry and his Wife Jimmy Lastly that all
 The rest of my Estate which is not killed away be sold or hired
 at the pleasure of my Executor and the Money from thence arising
 kept in his hands except such part as he shall require in raising clothing
 and Educating my three youngest children without his being account-
 able for any Interest thereon until my Daughter Jane arrives to the
 age of Eighteen years then to be equally divided among my Daughters
 And I hereby appoint my son John W. Dick sole Executor of
 this my Last Will and Testament In Witness Whereof I the said
 Thomas Dick have to this my Last Will and Testament set my
 Hand and Seal the day and year above Written
 Signed sealed published and declared Thos Dick
 by the said Thomas Dick the testator
 in his Last Will & Testament in the presence
 of us who were present at the time of signing
 and sealing thereof
