I Thomas Dillworth of the County of Gulfport and State of North Carolina being Weak of body but of sound and perfect mind & memory Blessed be Almighty God for the same, do make and publish this my Last Will & Testament in manner & form following that is to say.

First I give and bequeath unto my beloved Wife Sarah Dillworth my whole Tract of Land Containing One hundred & Ninety Nine Acres and Forty Two Poles to have & to hold during her Natural life or Widowhood, and at her death or Marriage to be equally divided amongst my lawful heirs. I further give and bequeath to my beloved Wife Sarah Dillworth my Horrid Mare Called Fanny, and Two of the best Choices of my Cattle my whole Stock of Hogs, all my Farming Tools Household & Kitchen furniture, and also my whole Crop of Corn Wheat Flax & Cotton during her Natural life or Widowhood, and at her death or Marriage to be equally divided among my heirs should there be any left known to belong to the Old Stock.

To my Oldest Daughter Nancy Dillworth I give and bequeath One Bed & one Cow & Furniture to the Amount of Forty Dollars inclusively.

To my eldest son Benjamin Dillworth I give and bequeath One Horse worth Forty Dollars.

To my son Lindsey Dillworth I give & bequeath One Horse worth Forty Dollars.

To my second daughter Nancy Dillworth I give & bequeath One bed, and one Cow & Furniture to the Amount of Forty Dollars inclusively.

To my third son George Dillworth I give and bequeath one Horse worth Forty Dollars.

To my third daughter Fanny Dillworth I give and bequeath one bed and one Cow and Furniture to the Amount of Forty Dollars inclusively.

To my fourth son Thomas D. Dillworth I give & bequeath One Horse worth Forty Dollars

To my fourth daughter Perkins D. Dillworth I give & bequeath One bed, one Cow and Furniture to the Amount of Forty Dollars inclusively.

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 Which said several Legacies I will and Order shall be paid to the above
 named Heirs when of age and not before.
 I further will & bequeath that my old Slave with the residue of my stock of
 Cattle remain on the Premises for the support & benefit of the family. -
 I further Will & bequeath that the undivided share of my Estate shall be equally
 divided among my Children and also my beloved Wife Sarah Dillworth to
 have one Child part during life or widowhood
 And lastly as to all the rest residue and Remainder of my personal
 Estate goods & Chaucer of whatever kind of which I may die seized to be
 sold after a decent entombment of my body and paying all my just
 debts to be equally divided among all my Children,
 And I hereby Appoint my Wife Sarah Dillworth and my eldest son
 Benjamin Dillworth Executors of this my last Will & Testament hereby
 revoking all other Wills by me made in things whereof I have
 hereto set my hand and seal this Nineteenth day of November
 in the year of our Lord One Thousand Eight hundred & Twenty
 Nine
