- 3rd. I give And be left to my Eldest daughter Anna Weston Sum for her  
use in Wal & the same gardenes at m. Weston Park.
- 4th. I give to my Grand daughter Anna Weston my library books growing my (Mary Weston)  
late son her first child Dead Weston & Anna Weston it is to have the book with his bid  
one pair in time of her death.
- 5th. I give to my son Henry Weston my land And all my other property And  
effects myself And to a lesser number & at my wife Anna
- 6th. As to my children with Weston & Weston the Children Emma Weston fully breaken  
I will give the children to each other & have given all that I can Able.
- 7th. I make And ordain my wife Anna Weston to be this my last will &  
testimony And to the All thinges Mrs Weston when she dies the same Thomas  
Weston have to her the last summe due her. And my hand is upon the  
day & year above written.

seen Mr. West & the former Parkhouse at York to his death —
- 4th. I thank my Lord and Master for giving me to my dear love young my Daugther  
Alice Queen for good rest and peace & may she be with her God  
Amen for ever & for ever.
- 5th. Of course my dear Elizabth, Mrs. Parkhouse and all my other property & lands  
Effects may all that to a poor widow & as my wife I make
- 6th. As to Dr. Chidley with his wife & son the Middlesex Opera House fully provided  
I thank the Captain (as much as I can give) on that & all able  
I make and entreat of the same as Elizabth. Please to do this my last will &  
testament further all things else which I have done the same the said Thomas  
Elizabth have to Dr. Dr. Mrs. and their son the same the same the same the  
day & year above written.
