And all the remainder of my household furniture to be equally divided amongst my daughters Mary Margaret Anna & Jane and also the negro child Called Carty an equal Right Also the plantation I now live on With all the pertinences therof during also if living single but when married or dead to return to my son Thomas and all the rest of my property to be sold and all my lawful debts to be paid and the remainder to be equally divided Amongst my four Children Margaret, Anna Jane & Thomas again I except the Smith Tools which I give my Thomas. At the same time I do appoint my son Thomas and Alexander Gray joint Executors of this my Last Will & Testament to which I have hereunto set my hand seal this fifteenth day of November in the year of our Lord One Thousand Eight hundred & Twenty signed sealed & delivered in the presence
