To my son George Five Dollars. To my daughter Nelly Colerist a Negro boy called Ephraim. To my son William Five Dollars. To my son Samuel Five Dollars To my daughter Margurat One Negro boy Daniel by Name. To my daughter Ann One Negro boy called Spencer. To my daughter Sans One Negro boy called Berret. To my son Thomas my plantation formerly belonging to my son George Hamilton and all the fixtures thereof Also a Watch and Bed & furniture.

And all the remainder of my household furniture to be equally divided amongst my three daughters Namely Margurat Ann & Sans and also the negro child called Catty an equal Right Also the plantation I now live on With all the fixtures thereof during life if living single but when Married or dead to return to my son Thomas and all the rest of my property to be sold and all my lawfull debts to be paid and the remainder to be equally divided amongst my four Children Margurat Ann Sans & Thomas again I Except the Smith Tools which I Give my Thomas. At the same time I do appoint my son Thomas and Alexander Gray joint Executors of this my Last Will & Testament To which I have hereunto set my hand & seal this fifteenth day of November in the year of our Lord One Thousand Eight hundred & Twenty Signed sealed & delivered in the presence of us.

der to be equally divided amongst my four children Margaret
Ann Jane & Thomas again I except the smock Tools which I Give my
Thomas At the same time I do appoint my son Thomas and Alexander
Gray joint Executors of this my last Will & Testament To which I
