Manner following that is to say.

1st Though the uncertainty of life I give my soul to God in death
and my Body to him to be used

2^d I will and bequeath that all my just debts paid together with
my funeral expenses.

3^d It is my will that my home plantation together with my farms
I give to one of a younger than plan and my Andrew Patterson
plan to equally divided between my two sons William S.
Haukin and Robert S. Haukin my beloved wife Martha Haukin
So long as she shall live to support off the land during
her life time.

4th I will and bequeath to my son Alfred Haukin one Negro boy
named Adam having already paid eight hundred and fifty
dollars for his work.

5th I will and bequeath

William Patterson that is to say,

1st Through the uncertainty of life I give my soul to God in death
and my Body, Blood to the church

2. I will and bequeath that all my first estate paid together with
my funeral expenses.

3. It is my will that my home plantation together with my farms
I give to my younger Son John and my daughter Patterson
place to equally divided between my two sons William S.
Hankin and Robert S. Hankin my beloved wife Martha Hankin
do live I give unto her support off the land during
her life time.

4. I will and bequeath to my son Albert Hankin one Negro boy
named Adam having already paid eight hundred and fifty
dollars for his land.

5. I will and bequeath to my son Moses M. Hankin the cash
I paid for the land say five hundred dollars I give him
one Negro boy named Sam which has since died I therefore will
and bequeath to him one Negro boy named Amos as his part of
the of the Negroes hereafter to be valued as decided.

6 As I have already given my son in law W. Lewis and his wife Elizabeth and my son Ed named Caroline and my son in law Paul Wells and his wife Lucretia and my son Ed named Melinda I now will and begeth to my son William S. Hunkin and my wife named Jack and to my son Robert S. Hunkin and my wife named Caroline and to my daughter Polly S. Hunkin and my wife named Rachel.

7 I will and begeth to my daughter Mathew Woodhouse to the tract of land on which she now lives to be hers and her heirs forever to my estate a land which I hold on her husband's land.

8 It is my will that my wife Martha Hunkin have my Negro woman Mary to wait on her during her life and to dispose of as she thinks proper at her death the rest of my Negroes to be sold and divided among all my children except my son Moses as he is provided for in the 5th section of this will.

9. It is my will that each of my three children William, Moses and Polly each to have a good horse and saddle and a bed and its furniture Polly to have such other articles for house keeping as her sisters get.

10 It is my will that my wife have my carriage and the use of a horse that she may select.

11 It is my will that each of my three children William, Robert & Polly

11 It is my will that each of my three children William, Robert & Paddy
have two acres each the Boys to get such articles for house keeping as
their Brothers get.

12 It is my will that all my beds and their furniture not already named be
left to my wife to dispose of as she thinks proper.

13 It is my will that the Bedchamber of my stock house & farming utensils
kitchen hold and kitchen furniture remain for the use of my wife and
such of the children as may remain with her during her life then to be
sold or divided.

14 If there ^{should} be any stock or horses that the family can spare it is my will that the ^{same}
And I hereby make and ordain my true and lawful executor and
