Camp Rogers June 21st - 1864 -

Col. in compliance to an order sent to me by Capt King to forward to you by mail a report of the dismounted men in my Group I herewith submit the following report with facts as asked for I have in my Group 14 dismounted men including Supt B. F. Lurme & Private J. M. White who were captured them & their horses at Fort Gates in Florida on the first day of April last & were still prisoners of war Capt L. H. Lane & Wade E. Crawley who dismounted himself & went the time I left the Regt for this place and who is now in arrest for it at V. M. Gray & Jackson B. M. Bowen W. Spiers R. J. Thompson E. G. Duke M. Reynolds W. M. Lendon & Grimes & Warren I left at V. M. all my dismounted men except privates W. M. Lendon & Grimes and I Warren whom I know to have horses and whom I have tried to send after them and whom have been dismounted but a short time E. G. Duke and M. Reynolds are detained in I. M. department as teamsters W. M. Lendon & I Grimes & I Warren I brought with me with your consent as they had been dismounted but a short time and as they had horses at home & would mount themselves if allowed to go after them all of which is respectfully submitted - I have the honor to be very respectfully your obedient Servant -

Battalion of Artillery is hereby transferred from said
command to company of Capt James R. Turner
of the 4th Regiment Ca. early commanded by
Col. G. L. Clinch now stationed near Bruns-
wick Georgia in consideration of his having
furnished a substitute in the person of
Martin Legate, who having been examined
by the Battalion Surgeon and pronounced fit
for military duty, was regularly mustered in
to company & this day - a descriptive roll
is herewith attached
Sergeant Alexander will report for duty at Bruns-
wick Ga. or wherever the 4th Regt. of Ca. may
then be stationed by the 21st day of April
or be considered a deserter
