of my Executors & all the Stock of Milk that is on hand.

Item I Give & bequeath unto William Kirkman Son of Peter Kirkman & Co.
that Child that I named all my lands that I am seized or ~~possess~~
profits. I provided the said William Kirkman pays over to my Executors
William Kendall the Sum of One Hundred and fifty Dollars within
Term of two or Three years from the time the said Will is Executed
Item I Give and bequeath unto the Elderly Quaker One Saddle Girth the
One She always lay & Claim to.

Item I Give and bequeath unto the said Elderly Quaker Five
Dollars.

Item I Give and bequeath unto George Kirkman Son of William Kirkman
My Horse that is Called Penny.

Item It is my Will and desire that the balance of my property be
Sold and except One white faced steifer that I Give & bequeath
unto Polly Kirkman & the Money arising from the Sale of my
Property to be applied to the Payment of my debts. If there
Should be a Balance of Money left after discharging any of my
debts It is to be equally divided between my beloved wife &
George William Kendall.

Item I Give to my Wife One Tin kettle & flat chow to be taken out
of the above mentioned property that was allowed to be sold.

raised in the second general at the direction of my executors
as for touching my worldly estate that it has pleased God to
bless me with in this life I give & bequeath in the following manner

all its furniture One feather Bed & furniture One set one Cow
Shedding box One New Mortar One set of Iron Spades One

of meat in her hand & as much of the Stock of Grain as
will be sufficient to support her for one year but the direction
of my Executors & all the Stock of Meat that is on hand.

Item I Give & bequeath unto William Westman Son of Peter Westman &c.
that Child that I named all my lands that I am Seised or ~~possessing~~
profits provided the said William Westman pays over to my Executors
William Westman the Son of One Hundred and fifty Dollars within
Term of two or three years from the time the said Child is Enrolled
Item I Give and bequeath unto John Elderly Quaker One Suffer Calf the
One the always lay & claim to.

Item I Give and bequeath unto the said Elderly Quaker Five
Dollars.

Item I Give and bequeath unto George Westman Son of William Westman
My Horse that is Called Brandy.

Item It is my Will and desire that the balance of my property be
Sold and except One white face steuffer that I give & bequeath
unto Polly Westman & the Money arising from the Sale of my
Property to be applied to the payment of my debts. If there
Should be a Balance of money left after discharging of my
debts It is to be equally divided between my beloved wife &
George William Westman.

Item I Give to my wife One Tin kettle & flat iron to be taken out
of the above mentioned property that was allowed to be sold
unto & Constable & George William Westman my Son.
