First I give bequeath to my beloved wife Sarah all my stock and household furniture during her life and at her death all to my son John - Also I give to my son Joseph a certain piece of land beginning at Elijah Kershner Southeast corner running North fifty poles the turning & running East to Joseph Jackson one acre - Also I give to my well beloved son John whom I likewise constitute executor & ordain this sole executor of this my last will & Testament of all the rest of my lands messuages & Tenements by him freely to be pursued & enjoyed and hereby utterly disclaim revoke and disannul all and ever other former Testament wills legacies bequests and bequests by me in any ways before named written and bequeathed ratifying and confirming this and no other to be my last will and Testament

The contents whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this sixteenth day of September in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and four.
