our Court by the oath of John Leathewell one of the subscribers witness thereto  
and on motion ordered to be recorded First The Henderson C<sup>l</sup>

In the Name of God Amen. I William Montgomery of the State of North  
Carolina and County of Guilford being in health of body and sound in mind have thought  
it proper to make this my last will and Testament revoking and disannulling all former  
by me made wills or by word of mouth and this only to be my last will and testa-  
ment in manner and form as follows.

I give and bequeath unto my wife Hannah Montgomery one third part  
of my movable Estate and to have the Plantation on which I now live at her  
use during her natural life or widowhood.

I give to my Eldest Son William Montgomery one Silver dollar  
And unto my Eldest Daughter Frances Buchanan one Silver dollar

And to my Elizabeth Bailey my second Daughter I give one Silver dollar  
and I give unto Hannah Whittle one Silver dollar

I give unto my Daughter Mary one horse and Saddle one bed and furniture

And I give unto my son John Montgomery all my Smith tools  
And unto my son David I give all my lands namely the Plantation on which  
I now live and his Mother's houses or manage the land I bought of John Gid  
and the forty five acres I bought between Edmund Neglumor John Gidliest and  
self unto David David is to have all the moneys that is not willed away already  
and further said David is to pay unto his sister Elizabeth child called from  
thence forth under my care the sum of fifty pounds hard money to be paid unto  
said child when she arrives at the age of eighteen years and David is to settle all my  
both tools and bridle out of legacy and as to my books I desire them to be given  
as follows to Francis Buchanan 100 Lamach book upon the divine attributes  
To my son John the same I willer on Heymition and the remainder of the bed  
to be divided equally between my wife Hammah and my son David And fur  
ther that in case my wife Hammah should marry that she take no part  
in my movable Estate and give up the house and Plantation unto my son David  
Witnesse whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this fourte  
day of July in the year of our Lord one thousand Seven hundred and Sixty six
