last will and testament

Item 1st I will my body to its Mother dust, dust and my soul
unto Almighty God who gave it to me

Item 2nd I will that all my debts ^{of any} and my funeral
expenses be paid by my representatives -

Item 3rd It is my will and desire that my beloved wife Hannah
Moore have all my property of every description during her
natural life. Except what I may give unto my son Walter
Elmer Moore

Item 4th I will unto my beloved son J. E. Moore one horse
and saddle one bed and furniture one cow and calf and
one negro boy by the name of Edmond about seven years
old to him and his heirs forever and this is given to him for
services here before performed and to make him ~~equal~~ ^{equal} with
the rest of the children who have left me -

Item 5th it is my will that after the death of my wife that
my representatives sell the property and pay unto Mrs. Moore
one dollar and also unto James Moore one hundred dollars
and also unto Eliza Moore one hundred dollars -
Item 6th it is my will that the children of Nancy Bennett
Laughter and Anderson Smith's my son in law with all the
rest of my children have the balance of my property
Equally divided amongst them

Item 7th I give unto my beloved son Walter Moore and Elmer
Elmer Moore my Exors.
