 be God) do this 22nd day of January in the Year of Our Lord one Thousand
 Eight Hundred & Twenty four make Ordain & publish this my last will &
 Testament in manner following that is to say, of all the personal property
 which I have & may have & do possessed of, that my Executors take into
 possession & sell according to the common manner of the disposing of such
 after discharging all my just debts & defraying my Burial Expenses the residue
 of the Money to be Equally divided into four Parts One fourth of which is to
 be paid Over to James Lucas if living or to his heirs One fourth to John
 Lucas or his heirs One fourth to be detained in the hands of Wilkins Lucas
 for his Own Use whom I design my Executor & the Other One fourth to be
 Equally divided between my two Grand Children William & Franky kindly
 as to the part which may be coming to John Lucas it is my will that Wilkins
 Lucas pay it Over to him without Interest thereon when ever a legal power
 of Attorney shall be sent or sd John Lucas comes for it & not otherwise and
 I do hereby make & Ordain my son Wilkins Lucas sole Executor of this my
 last Will & Testament. In Witness whereof I the said William Lucas
 have to this my last Will & Testament set my hand & Affixed my seal
 the day & Year above. Written.
