Residue of my property and should there be any
Residue after Compting that Object, it is my Will that
the said Residue together with the above mentioned property
be to my wife, after her Death or the termination of her
Widowhood which ever may happen first, be equally divided
between my three Children (leg^t) Manford, Sharlock, William
Davis, & Noah, Reddick - it is my Request that my Brother
William Hollowell & my friend Sampson Sharlock act as
Executors to this my last Will & Testament -
