Viz. I give unto my daughter Nancy Carter ten Shillings. I give unto my daughter Elizabeth Tette Ten Shillings. I give unto my daughter Polly Carter ten Shillings. I give unto my daughter Delia Carter ^{ten Shillings} I give to my daughter Sally Carter one bed and furnitur, one cow and calf and one Chest. I give unto my Son Harry Carter one bed and furnitur and cow and calf. I give unto my Son Gideon Carter one horn that is now called his. I give unto my Son Joseph Carter, all my Land Stock of horses, cattle and hogs household & kitchen furnitur out of which he is to maintain his mother and pay all my just debts provided she will continue with him and if my said Son should die without a lawful Issue, my wish and desire is that all that he owns may be equally divided between my Son Harry and my Son Gideon. I do hereby constitute and appoint my Son Joseph Executor to this my last Will and Testament In Witness whereof, my hand and Seal this 15 August 1810.
