& Debts is paid out. I Desire may be Equally Divided between my
Nine Daughters Lovell, Catharine, Lucy, Anna, Mary, Sammy, Susanah,
Betsey, Sarah, & Patty Marshall. Lastly I nominate & appoint
my Brother Saml. Marshall & my son Stephen Marshall my
Whole & sole Executors of this my last Will & Testament & Desire
my Estate may be Divided according to the Pleasure of my Exrs. & by
this Will I do Disannul & Revoke all other Wills heretofore made
by me. Witness my hand & Seal this November 1. Day. 1784.
