Drawn to me. Recorded in Washington
of the Executors therein named came in and was duly
qualified thereto -

Witness my hand & seal
this 1st day of Feb 1843

In the name of God Amen I Edward Jackson
of Halifax County & State of North Carolina being Weak in
Body but of sound mind and Memory (Blessed be God for the
same) do this twentieth Day of February in the year of our
Lord Eighteen Hundred & Threes, do make this my last Will
and Testament, that is to say - I commend my soul
into the hands of Almighty God who gave it me & my Body to
the Earth from whence it came in hopes of a Joyfull Resurrec-
tion, thro' the merits of my Saviour Jesus Christ - and as for that
Mortuary Estate it has pleased God to Bless me & after paying my
Just Debts, Funeral Expenses &c) I dispose thereof as follows -
First, I leave unto my Beloved Wife Jackson all my Estate
Real & Personal until my son Beverly Turner Jackson arrives
to the age of Twentyone years - Then my Estate to her Equally
Divided & my Beloved Wife to have a thirds part, for & during
her natural life, & at her Death to be Equally Divided

Among my children — I give my Son Beverly Turner Jackson when he arrives to the age of Twenty one years, His Equal part of my Estate aforesaid to him and the Heirs Lawfully Begotten of His Body Forever — My will is that when my Estate is Divided, that my Daughter Polly Jackson, part of my Estate aforesaid, & my son Hardy Tho: Jackson, part of my Estate aforesaid be sold by my Executors & the Money paid upon Interest till they come of age & that they take their Parts as they come of age Respectively — I give my Daughter Polly Jackson Her part of the Money & Interest aforesaid when she come of age to her & the Heirs of Her Body Lawfully Begotten Forever — I give my son Hardy Thomas Jackson when he arrives to the age of Twenty one years his part of the money and Interest aforesaid to him and the Heirs of His Body Lawfully Begotten Forever —
Heaven be my Guide
