of this transitory life & that all, I lack most health
to death where it shall please God to call me hence
I constitute & declare this my last will &
Testament, in form, following — — — — —
& unwilling, all by these Presents, all & every testam.
Will & Wills before me heretofore made, & I declared either
by word or writing, & this day to be taken, in my
last will & Testament, & so other, & first having
Penitent & sorry from the Bottom of my heart for my sins
past most humbly desiring forgiveness for the same
& committing my soul unto almighty God my Saviour &
Redeemer, in whom & by the merits of Jesus Christ
I trust & believe, that, assured by a Sould & that my
soul with my Body at a general day, the Resur-
rection shall arise again with joy & triumph
the fruits of Christs Health, & Passion prooves
& inherit, the Kingdom of heaven. Prepared for
his Elect & Chosen, & only ready to be buried in such
a place, where it shall please my Executors, hereafter
named, shall appoint & move of the setting of my
Temporal Goods such Goods, Chattels, & effects
it hath pleased God, at my desire, to bestow upon
me. I do order & desirous of the same in manner
& form following. Vizt. — — — — —

First, And that all those debts & dues, as I owe in
right of conscience to any person or persons whatsoever
shall be well & truly paid & contented, within conve-
nient time after my decease, by my Executors hereafter

& unwilling, all by these Presidents, all & every instant.
Wicks & Bills lay me. threats fine made, & I declared either
by word or Writing, & this surely to be taken, in my
First will & Testament, & no other, & first Being
Penitent & sorry from the Bottom of my heart for my sins
past & yet hidously desiring for judgments for the sins
& committing of. unto almighty God my Saviour &
Redeemer, in whom & by the merits of Jesus Christ
I trust. & believe, that, assured by his word & that my
Soul will my Body at a general day, the resur-
rection shall arise again with joy, & cleargh.

The merits of Christ's death, & Passion procured
& inherit, the Kingdom of heaven. Prepared for
his elect & chosen, & only fit to be buried in such
a place, where it shall please my Executors, hereafter
named, shall appoint & move of the setting of my
Temporal goods & such Goods. Chattels. & effects as
it hath pleased God, above my deserts, to bestow upon
me. I do order & command of the same in manner
& form following. Vizt.

First Will that all those debts & dues, as I owe in
right of conscience to any person or persons whatsoever
shall be well & truly paid & contented, within convenient
time after my decease, my just debts, hereafter
named.

I am, I give & bequeath unto my loving wife, Sarah
the Negro mark. Called. York & her riding Saddle
Item, I give & bequeath unto my son Charles
Williams Two hundred Acres of Land more or less
lying in Halifax County in the Province of Carolina
and bounded as follows Beginning at a maple
in a branch in a ridge in the South side of proximous
to down the Branch to proximous Creek thence across

to the other side to the Usking Spring Branch thence
Along the Branch through the Plantation by the Spring
to the head and so to a white Oak corner of the Oppositt
line and so up each side of Pinemore Creek according
to the Bounds of the patent.

Item I give and Bequeath unto my Son Francis Williams
Two hundred acres of Land more or less it being part
of the same tract and still by the same patent and
Bounded by the aforesaid Spring Branch (Bounded) on
one end and so down each Side of Pinemore Creek accord-
ing to the Bounds of the patent aforesd including my
Settling houses.

Item I give and Bequeath unto my Daughter Bettyann
Williams Ten pounds proclamation money.

Item I give and Bequeath unto my Daughter Mary Ann
Williams Ten pounds proclamation money
