Burrell Pope, one plantation lying on the same containing, two hundred
& nine acres of Land which fell to me by kinship, from Banaly McKenney
& also one Negro Girl named Pratt, to her in like & assigned for ever.
I give & bequeath to my four younger Sons, Willie Pope John Pope
Henry Austin Pope, & Wiley Pope each of them a part of my Land & Negroes, if I
have not bequeathed before, to them & their Heirs & assigns for ever, to be
equally divided to them by John Bradford Jesse Pope, & William Senea
either two of them, & I also appoint John Bradford, Jesse Pope & my
well beloved Wife Sabitha, who is sole Ex^r of this my last Will & Testament
