In the name of God Amen I Henry Poyner of Halifax
being weak of Body but of sound mind and Memory do make
and ordain this my last will & Testament in the manner and
form following that is to say - That a part of my Estate such as
my Executors shall think proper, be sold sufficient to satisfy all
my Just debts - I Give & bequeath to my Daughter Martha Poyner

(to wit) three negroes (to wit) Rose & Ginny & her child. I
 Give & bequeath to my Daughter Alsey Higgs three Negroes
 (to wit) Violet Hager & Edgar, I leave to my Wife Mary
 Boyner the Land & Plantations whereon I now live and as
 much of the Stocks & Furniture as my Executors shall think
 necessary) also three Negroes (to wit) Jim, Amey, & Milley during
 her natural life. I Give to my son Andrew Boyner one
 Horse, Bridle & Saddle to be of the value of one Hundred &
 Twenty five Dollars — I Give and bequeath to my son Robert
 Boyner one Horse ~~and~~ saddle & Bridle to be of the value of
 one Hundred & Twenty five Dollars, also the Tract of Land
 whereon I now live after the Death of his Mother on his
 Paying my son Andrew Boyner either in money or giving up
 a part of the Land so as to make the Tract of Land given
 to my son Andrew Boyner by Bridgman Turner Equal in value
 to the Tract I now live on. The difference in the value of
 the two Tracts of Land, to be set by my Executors — I Give
 & bequeath to my Two Daughters Mary Boyner, and Harriet
 Boyner all the rest of my Property or Estate whatsoever, it is my
 wish that the Property live to my Wife and the Property
 of my two Daughters should be kept together until the

Wish that the property due to my Wife and the Property
Given to my two Daughters should be kept together until the
Death of my Wife or the Marriage of one of my Daughters
& after the death of my Wife the three negroes (to wit)
Jim, Amy, & Milley be be equally divided between my two
Daughters Mary & Harriett and the stock & Furniture be
equally divided between my four Children, Mary Boyner
Andrew Boyner Robert Boyner, & Harriett Boyner, I do
nominate and appoint my two Friends Benjamin Pope and
Jesse Rhymes my Executors, Given under my hand and
Seal this 21st day of Feb^r 1803 in Presence of
