Item I give and bequeath to my Son Jarrad Weaver two negroes to witt Davie & Charles also a track of land that I purchased of William Hargrove, containing of two hundred and fifty three acres also one Cow & Calf 1 desk 1 Walnut table one feather bed and furniture to him and his heirs for ever

Item I give and bequeath to my daughter Cherry Weaver one negro boy named Jerry one negro girl named Judah one chest of drawers one Cow & Calf feather bed and furniture to her & her heirs for ever

Item I give and bequeath to my daughter Susannah Weaver one negro boy named Fred and one negro girl named Polly one chest of drawers one Cow & Calf one feather bed and furniture to her and her heirs for ever

Item I give and bequeath to my three daughters that I had by my first wife, Lucy Gary, Sally Gary, and Polly Drake twenty Silver dollars to them and their heirs for ever

Item I give unto beloved wife Mary Weaver, the rest of the land whereon I now live during her life or widowhood also the rest of my estate not mentioned except two first choice negroes which is to support my daughter Elisabeth Weaver during her life but in case the said Elisabeth leaves an issue in that case I give the said negroes her issue to them and their heirs for ever, but in case that she dies without an issue the said Negroes be equally divided between my daughters Cherry Weaver Jarrad Weaver and Susannah Weaver

Item I give to my three grand Children Judith, Richard H and Edwin Weaver twenty dollars to be equally divided between them which I wish them to lay out each in a mourning ring her share.

Item I give unto beloved wife Mary Weaver, the most of the land whereon I now live during her life or widowhood also the rest of my estate not mentioned except two first choice negroes which is to support my daughter Elizabeth Weaver during her life but in case the said Elizabeth leaves an issue in that case I give the said negroes her issue to them and their heirs for ever, but in case that she dies without an issue the said Negroes be equally divided between my daughters Cherry Weaver Jarrad Weaver and Susannah Weaver

Item I give to my three grand Children Judith, Richard H and Edwin Weaver twenty dollars to be equally divided between them which I wish them to lay out each in a mourning ring her share.

Item my will is that the land that I gave my wife the use of at her death or marriage shall be sold and be equally divided between my daughters Cherry, Elizabeth and Susannah but in case Elizabeth dies without issue her part to be equally divided between Cherry & Susannah Weaver

Item my will or after paying my just debts & at the death of my wife Mary Weaver that the remaining of my estate shall be equally divided between my daughters Cherry Jarrad and Susannah Weaver to them & their heirs for ever

Lastly I nominate and appoint my beloved wife Mary Weaver Executrex Jarrad Weaver, Henry Weaver Charles Malone Executors to this my last Will and Testament as witness,
