In the Name of God Amen, I Shem Sills being very sick
and weak in or in perfect mind & memory Thanks be given unto
God Calling unto mind the Mortality of my Body and knowing
that it is appointed for all men Once to die I do make &
ordain this my last will & Testament that is to say, principally
and first of all I give & recommend my soul into the hands
of Almighty God that gave it and my Body I recommend to the
earth to be buried in a decent Christian manner at the discretion of
my Executors nothing doubting but at the general Resurrection I shall
receive the same again by the mighty power of God and as touch-
ing such worldly Estate where with it hath pleased God to bless
me in this life I give devise and dispose of the same in the follow-
ing manner and form, First of all, I give to my loving son Shem
Sills the cattle that I lent to him and their increase and also I
give to my son Samuel Sills one feather bed & furniture one cow
half & yearling also I give to my son William Sills the young mare
and one cow half yearling and also I give to my loving daughter
Eliza Sills one feather bed & furniture one cow & sheep also I
give to my daughter Mary Sills one feather bed & furniture
one cow half & yearling also I lend to my daughter Pinner
Sills one cow & all her increase her life and after her death
to her children also I give to Cray Pinner twenty shillings also
I give to Sarah Hobbs forty shillings the rest of my Estate what
I have not particular given away I lend to my loving wife

Eliza Sills her widowhood or death and after her widowhood
or death I leave as follows, I give twenty shillings to my son
Benjamin Sills Esquire. As follows Thomas Sills Joshua John
and Ruben Sills also I leave the plantation whereon we now
live to my sons Samuel Sills William Sills also I give to my
son Isham Sills the place whereon he now lives and for my
Executors to sell such as they think can be spared the best
and the rest of my Estate to be equally divided amongst
my children as follows, Eliza Sills Isham Sills Mary Sills
and William Sills also I leave my two sons wholly Holy &c.
which is Samuel Sills and William Sills - March 3rd 1802.
