it hath Pleased almighty God to bless me with in this
life, I Give & Bequeath my in this form & manner
Item I Give unto my son William Bynum one
feather bed & furniture, Item I Give to my Grandson
John Bynum son of William Bynum one Negro
man Named Jack for him to be Posset & set
at the age of twenty one years, Item I Give unto
my Daughter Agnes Whitney five Cows, Item I
Give unto my son Nicholas Bynum one feather
bed and furniture, Item I Give unto my Son James
Num son of Nicholas Bynum one Negro man
Named Cuc Item I Give unto my Daughter Anna
Hill wife of Philip Hill one Negroman named Samuel
Item I Give unto Harriet Bly the Geare horse Gildon
two Barrels of Corn and Sixty Pounds of ~~the~~ Salt
and my will is that all the remainder Part of my Estate
shall be divided Equally between my son William Bynum
whom I adopt in addition of this my last Will & Testament and
my Slave Alice Agnes Whitney by whom he Posset & joy her
Bitterness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and sign my seal
this day and date at the writing, James Bynum ^{his} Sign'd Seal'd

my body to the Earth to be buried in Christian Manner
at the Discretion of my Executors, not doubting the
Recruit of the same ~~to~~ again by the Mighty
Power of God, and as touching smoke to take where with
it hath pleased almighty God to bless me with in this
life, I give & bequeath up in this form & manner —
Item I give unto my son William Bynum one
feather bed & furniture, Item I give to my grandson
John Bynum son of William Bynum one Negroe
man named Jacob for him to be Possess ^{with}
at the age of twenty one years, Item I give unto
my daughter Elizabeth Whiteley five Cows, Item I
give unto my son Michael Bynum one feather
bed and furniture, Item I give unto my son James
Bynum son of Richard Bynum one Negroe female
named Cain Item I give unto my daughter Anna
still wife of Philip Still one Negroe man named Sarah
Item I give unto Harriet Bly one Gray horse Gildon
two Barrels of Corn and Sixty Pounds of ~~the~~ bacon
and my will is that all the remainder Part of my Estate
shall be divided Equally between my son William Bynum
Whom I adopt execution of this my last Will & Testament and
my daughter Elizabeth Whiteley by Name, to Possess & joy for
Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and sign my seal
this day and date at the written ⁱⁿ January Bynum Sig'd Sealed
