

In the Name of God Amen I James Fawcett of Halifax County being very sick of body but of perfect sense and memory and calling to mind the Mortality of this Body and that it is appointed me once to die, and calling to mind, the few worldly things that God has blessed me with, I do give and dispose of them in manner and form as follows, Item I give my soul to God who gave it, and my body to be decently buried at the discretion of my Executors hereafter mentioned, and as to my worldly goods I give and dispose of them in manner and form as follows, Item I lend my Beloved wife Mary Fawcett the manure house and Plantation wherein I now live during her widowhood and if she should marry again, to my Children and to be divided between my two sons, Item I give to my son William Fawcett his part of the land on the East side of a line I have made in my land which I included in the manure house and Plantation I also give my son William Fawcett on gun and all my working Tools to him and his heirs forever, Item I give to my son James Cullen Fawcett his part of my land on the West side of the line I made for a division between my two sons to him and his heirs after him, Item I give and bequeath James McDonald one Cow heifer to him and his heirs after him, Item I give to my Beloved wife all my Stock and household furniture during her life or widowhood and then to be equally divided between my five Children she bore to me, I also desire if either my two Sons William Fawcett or James Cullen Fawcett should die without heirs, that others should have his part, Item I give to my daughter Mary Sparks, one Shilling, Item I give to my Son James Fawcett one Shilling, Item I give

Will, that others should here his part I then Give to my daughter Mary Sparks, one Shilling, I then Give to my Son James Fawcett one Shilling, I then Give to my Son John Fawcett one Shilling, I then Give to my daughter Betty M^r. Corbett one Shilling, I also do appoint my Beloved wife Mary Fawcett my whole and sole Executor of this my last Will and Testament, I make and Ordain this my last Will and Testament abolishing all other Wills I Ordain this my last Will and Testament, In Witness whereof I have set my Hand and Seal, this 6th day of January 1706.
