

James Hunter 1817

In the Name of God Amen I James Hunter of North Carolina in the County of Halifax being of sound mind and memory doth call to mind the uncertainty of this Life, I do hereby make and ordain this my last will and Testament in manner and form following To wit

Impairis I give or recommend my soul to god who gave it to me first, and my Body I desire may be buried at the Discretion of my Exors hereafter mentioned

Item I give and bequeath unto my son Robert Hunter Two Negroes Lucy and Dick I give also unto my son Robert all my Clothes one Feather Bed and Furniture my Steel James mare, my saddle and Bridle Two Sows and piggs Two Cows and Calf Two Ewes & Lambs one Large Iron pott half a dozen butter plates one Large Dish two Small Dishes to him & his heirs for ever with their several Increase

Item I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Sally Jones Hunter one Negro Girl name Nancy one Feather Bed & Furniture to her & his heirs for ever with her several Increase

Item The Rest of my Estate be it of what nature or kind soever I leave to be sold at Twelve Months Credit and the money arising from the Sales after my just Debt being paid I give and bequeath unto my following Children to be Equally Divided betwixt them to them & their heirs for ever always together

Now I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Sally Jones Hinton one Negro Girl
name Nancy one Feather Bed & Furniture to her & his heirs for ever with her
proper Increase,

Now the Rest of my Estate be it of what nature or kind soever I have to
be sold at Twelve Months Credit and the money arising from the sales after my
just Debts being paid I give and bequeath unto my following Children to be
Equally divided betwixt them to them & their heirs for ever to-wit
James Hinton, Christopher Hinton, Mary Smith, and Minns Hinton, is the five
following Children,

Last I do appoint Turner Mason and Nathan Turner Executors of this my last
will & Testament. I hereby revoke all former Will or Wills by me made as
Witness my hand and seal this first day of April Anno Domini one thousand seven
hundred & Eighty one,
