177 I give to my loving Wife Ann Bap during her Widowhood the Land & Plantations whereof I now live and likewise the following Negroes Tom & Mar his Wife Little Tom his Child, Tuby two beds and Furniture two Sows and pigs two Geese and fowls two Cows and Calves two hogs the frame and every other Reasonably necessary household stuff and it is my Will and desire that my Executors hereafter named shall divide all my estate that I do not give away and equally divide it among all my Brothers and Sisters.
I give and bequeath the Land whereon I now live as it altogether is and lies together to my brother Isaac Bap his heirs and assigns for ever after my Wife's Marriage.

I give and bequeath the Land on the east side of Back Swamp to my brother Jacob Bap to his heirs and assigns for ever.

I give all the rest of my estate not already given I desire should be equally divided among all my Brothers and Sisters. I do nominate and Appoint my Well beloved Wife Ann Bap and my neighbor Robert Cotton to be my Executors to this my Last Will and Testament, revoking disannulling all other Will or Wills by me made Rpts or any other power or powers for me and further I do say that this is my Will & the Will I would wish to be observed. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal Willingly by after My Seal this 4th day October 1786.
