and Declare this my last will and Testament in Manner and form
following Revoking and annulling by these Presents all and every
Testament and Testaments Will and Wills here tofore by me
made and Declared to be by word or writing and this is taken
only for my last will and Testament and none other
and I am being Penitent and sorry from the Bottom of my heart
for every sin Past Present and future I give and Commit my Soul
into the Hands of almighty God my Saviour and Redeemer in Whome and by the Merits
of Jesus Christ I Trust and believe assuredly to be saved
and to have full Permission of all my sins and that my
Soul with my body at a General Day of Resurrection
shall rise again with joy and thanksgiving the Merits of
Christ's Death and Passion Passes and inherit the Kingdom
of Heaven Prepared for his Elect and Chosen and my body
to be buried in such a place where it shall please to
